The Distinguished Woman Leader Award is intended to honor someone who:

Advocates for women and has either pioneered or been a catalyst for change. Champions the advancement of women in leadership roles and is a voice for all women in Higher Education.

Is celebrated as providing outstanding leadership to women in their institutions, field of expertise, and/or in society at large.

Is well-known for inspirational, inclusive, innovative work on behalf of women that is outside the scope of the nominee's formal regular job description.

The Rising Woman Leader Award is intended to honor someone who:

Has shown upward trajectory through advancement in leadership roles. Demonstrates commitment to advocating for other women's professional development, advancement or inclusion within their own sphere of influence. Is seen as a leader with great promise.

Is an active contributor within the ACE-WNI organization.

Nominees for both awards should be seasoned leaders in advanced stages of their careers and must be from an ACE WNI Member Institution.

Q. What is your role at your institution?

Q. What's the best leadership lesson you have learned?
